CHOIR ANTHEM

O Jesus Christ, thou dearest Lord,
Thou Prince of life and glory,
Thou with the Father art adored
In heaven, where saints surround thee.
How best can I the victory sing

COLLECTS:

O Almighty God, whose blessed Son called Matthew the tax collector to be an apostle and evangelist: give us grace to forsake the selfish pursuit of gain and the possessive love of riches that we may follow in the way of your Son Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

FIRST READING: 2 Corinthians 4. 1-6

Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God. And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For we do not proclaim

ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL READING: *Matthew 9. 9-13*

As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners."

POST COMMUNION PRAYER:

Almighty God, who on the day of Pentecost sent your Holy Spirit to the apostles with the wind from heaven and in tongues of flame, filling them with joy and boldness to preach the gospel: by the power of the same Spirit strengthen us to witness to your truth and to draw everyone to the fire of your love; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Or

Lord God, the source of truth and love, keep us faithful to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, united in prayer and the breaking of bread, and one in joy and simplicity of heart, in Jesus Christ our Lord.

10 AM SUNDAY SERVICES Since the beginning of September we have introduced some small changes to our 10am services, which will help us all to continue worshipping as one family during the vacancy period after Roy has left:

The general pattern of 10am services continues as before, with All-Age Worship on the 1st Sunday of the month, Holy Communion (now called All-Age Communion) weeks 2, 3 and 4, accompanied by the band on weeks 1 & 3 and the choir on weeks 2 & 4.

Trackers, for primary-aged children, will continue on 2nd, 3rd and 4th Sundays but they will now go to the St Andrew's Room rather than the choir vestry and will stay out for longer on the 2nd and 4th Sundays.

Families with children A number of other measures - such as refurbishing the toy/book bags for under-5s, better signing and an updated welcome pack - will help to welcome families to church.

Music - More variety of hymns and songs on all Sundays, with hymn practices before some services to help us learn unfamiliar hymns or songs. New singers and instrumentalists are always welcome for choir or band! **Readers and intercessors** - A mix of old and young to contribute across all services. Please let us know if you would like to take part in this way. Slides - A 'Contents' margin using Makaton signs has been added to the slides, so that people can see where we are in the service, what's coming up next, and how much longer there is to go!
