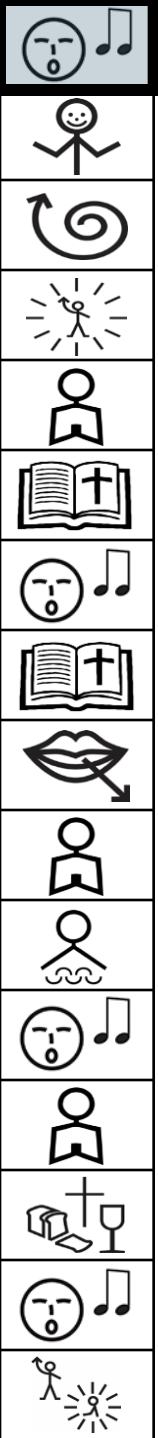

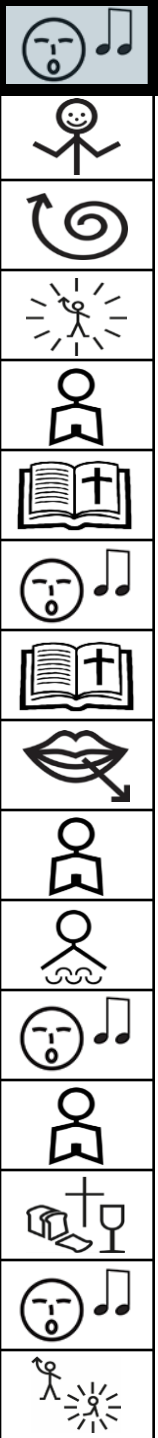

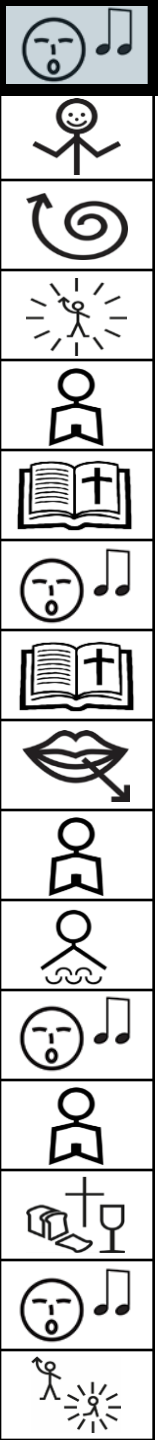


Processional Hymn (all may stand)

At mysteries so bright.



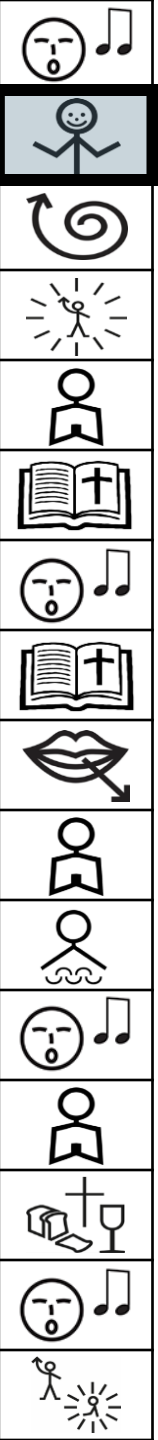
Crown him the Lord of peace,

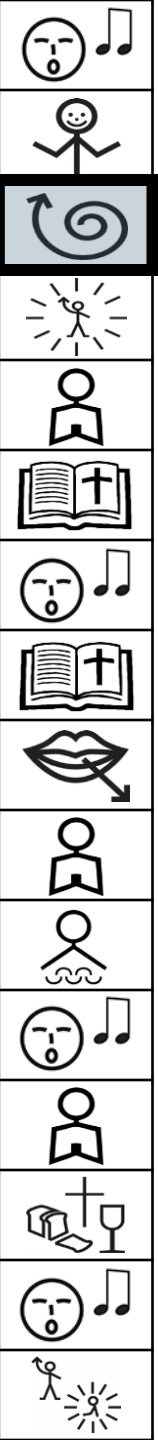
Prayers of Penitence (sit or kneel)

and to bring us to eternal life.

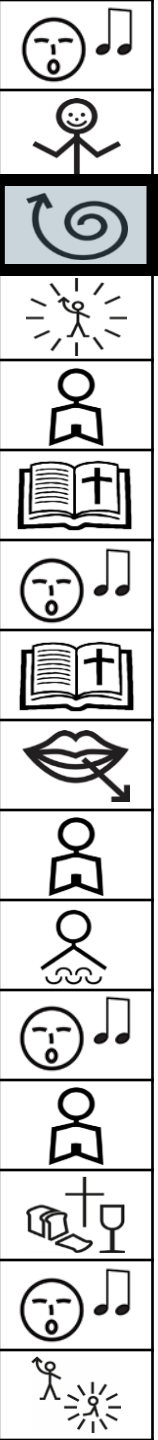
Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith,

ourselves.

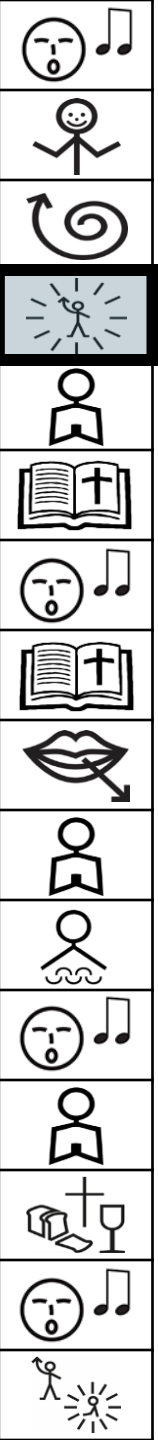

who has spoken through the prophets.**

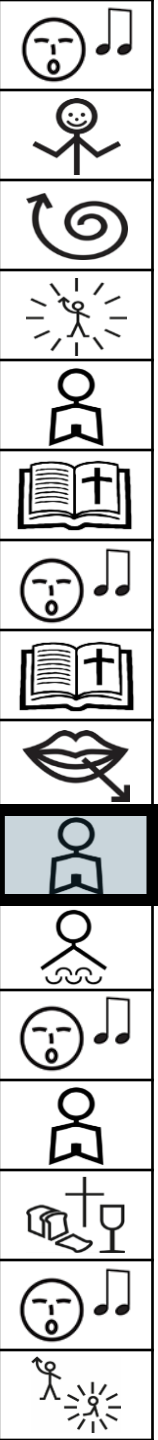


**We believe in one holy catholic and

and builds up our common life.

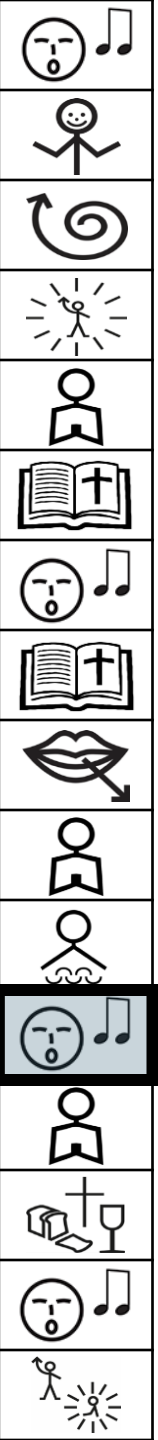

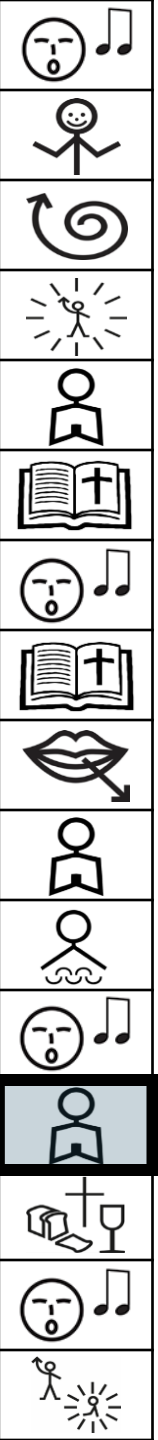


How wonderful the work of your hands, O Lord.

your love remained steadfast.

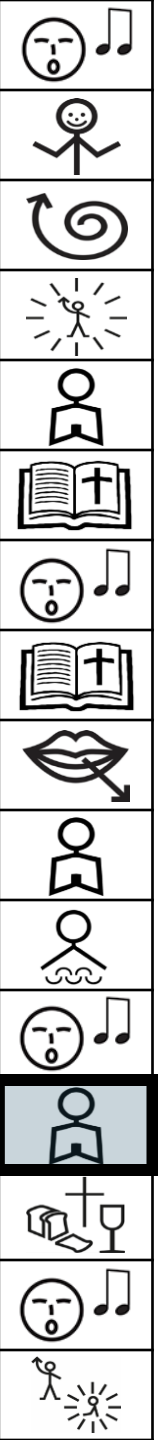


From them you raised up Jesus our Saviour,

do this in remembrance of me.

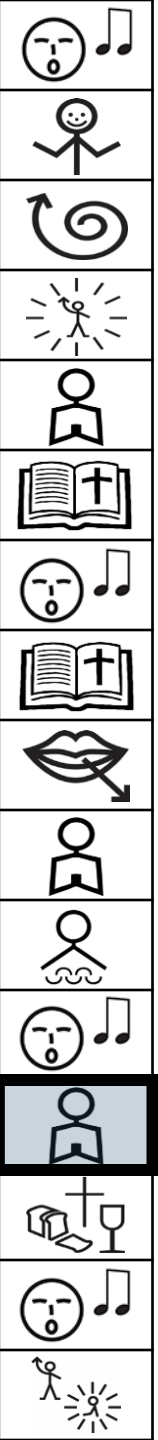


At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine,
he gave you thanks, and said:

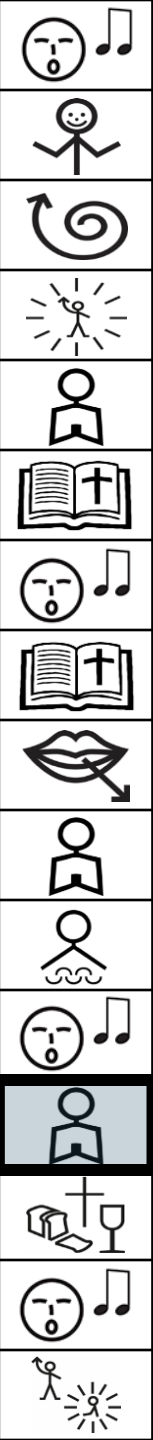
Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new

forgiveness of sins.

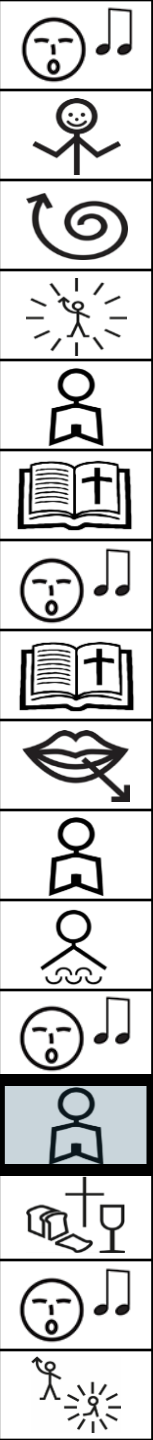
Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance

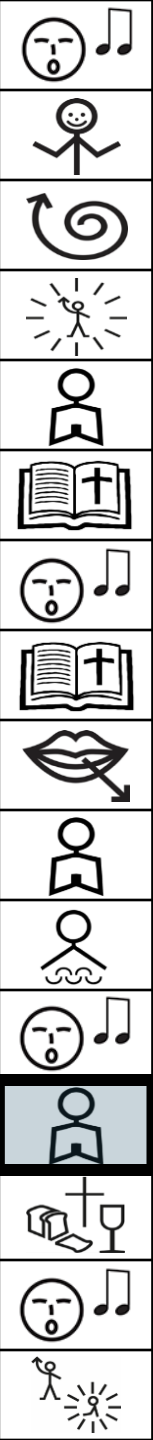


Father, we plead with confidence

dear Son.

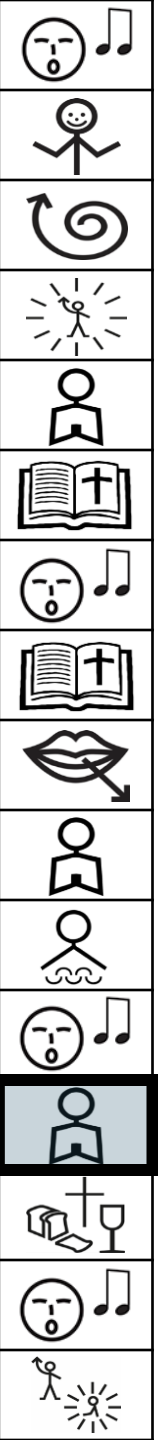
As we eat and drink these holy things in your

and build us into a living temple to your glory.



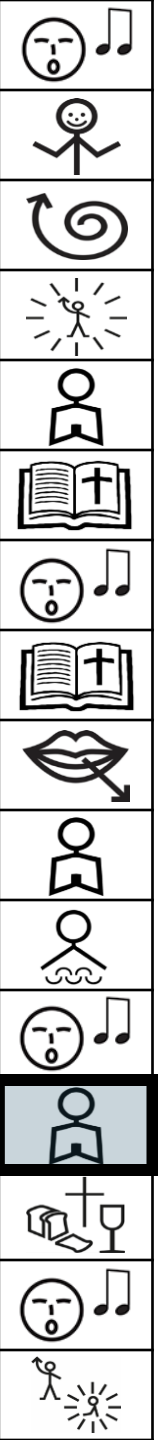
Bring us at the last with St. Nicolas and all the

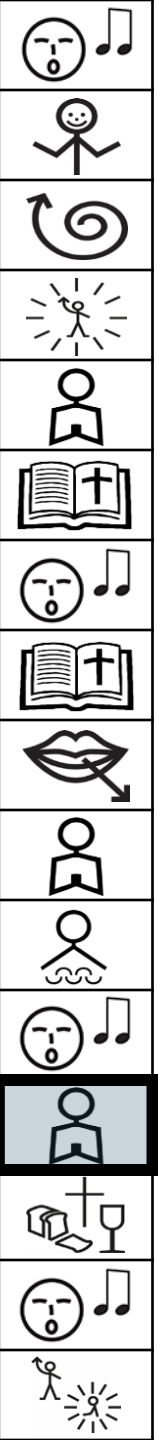

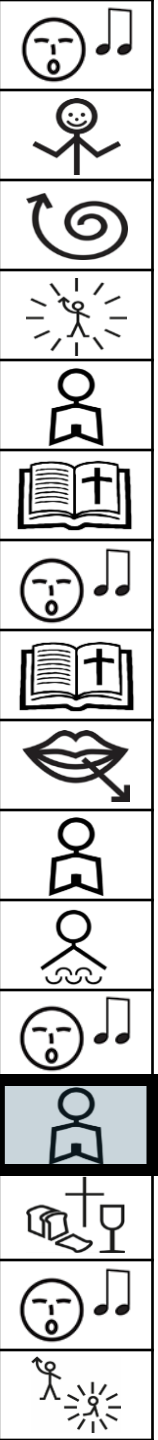
The Lord's Prayer (sit or kneel)

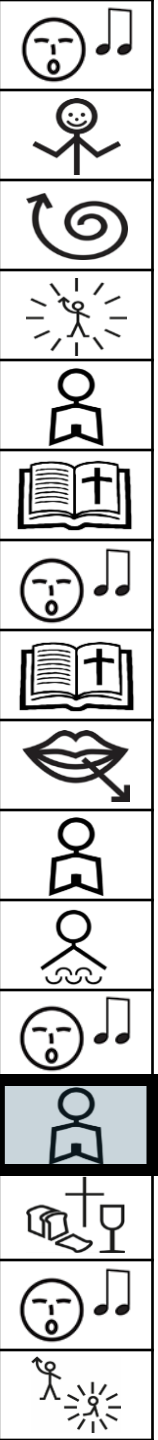


Breaking of the Bread

to share in the body of Christ.

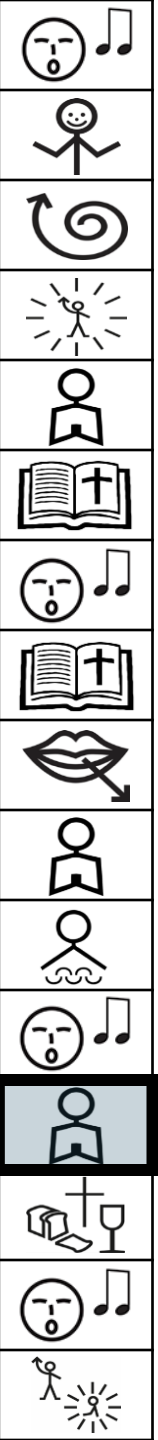
***All* Though we are many, we are one body,

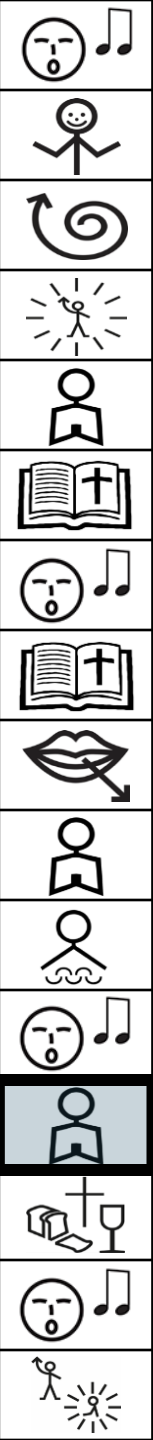

table.



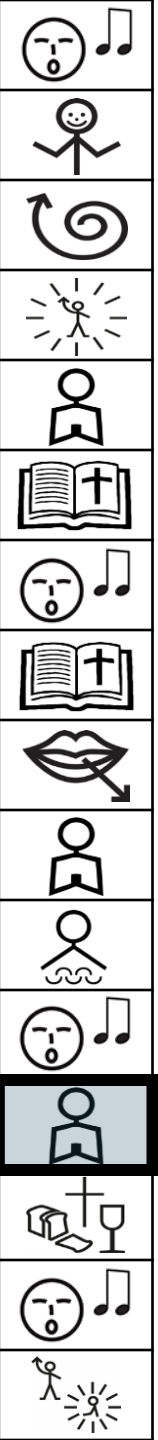
**But you, Lord, are the God of our salvation,

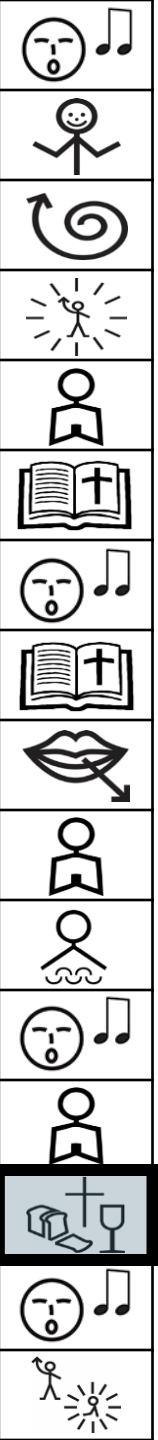


The president says this invitation to communion

and his blood which he shed for you.

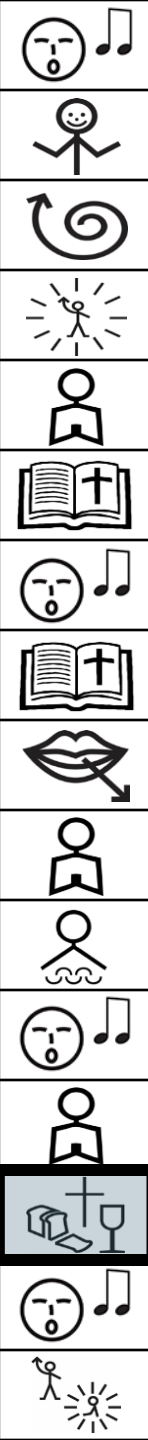

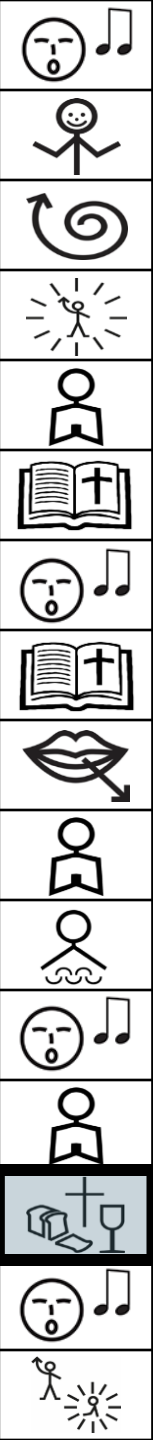
Sing, my tongue, the glorious battle,

Earth's Redeemer won the day.



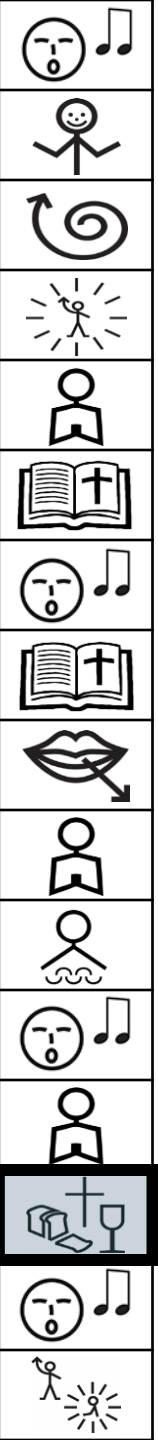
When at length th'appointed fullness

There the sacrifice to be.



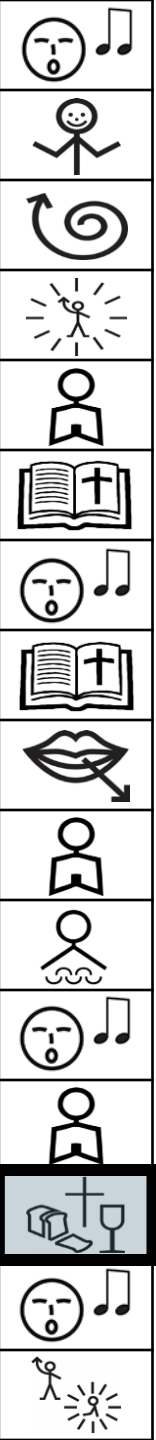
